

Hinckley Reservation:

Hinckley Reservation is located in Hinckley Township in Medina County. The reservation is dominated by the 90-acre Hinckley Lake, enjoyed year-round by a variety of visitors including water sport enthusiasts and anglers. Another attraction of the reservation is Whipp's Ledges, formed more than 250 million years ago with elevations rising 350 feet above Hinckley Lake. Worden's Ledges has unique carvings created in the 1940s by Noble Stuart, son-in-law to the ledges namesake—Hiram Worden. There is so much to explore in this pendant on the Emerald Necklace—get out and enjoy.

Park Rules:

A complete set of Cleveland Metroparks rules and regulations can be found at clevelandmetroparks.com.

- Respect the fragile nature of the environment by staying on the trails.
- Enjoy the natural environment, but do not disturb, destroy, deface, injure, or remove any part of the Park District including plants, animals, rocks, buildings, signs, equipment or property.
- Put litter in trash containers even if it's not your own.
- Cats and dogs must be on a leash not more than 8-feet long and are the only pets permitted in the Park District. Clean up after your pet.
- Keep to the right, pass on the left. Signal with bell or voice when passing.
- Bicycles permitted on roadways and designated trails.
- Reservation hours 6 a.m. - 11 p.m.
- Feeding wildlife is prohibited (505.04)
- Fishing is permitted with an Ohio fishing license, except in posted areas.
- The use of alcohol and drugs is not permitted.

Trail Etiquette:

- Control your speed and maintain a safe distance.
- Stay out of ski tracks when walking.
- Faster trail users yield to slower trail users.

Spillway Beach

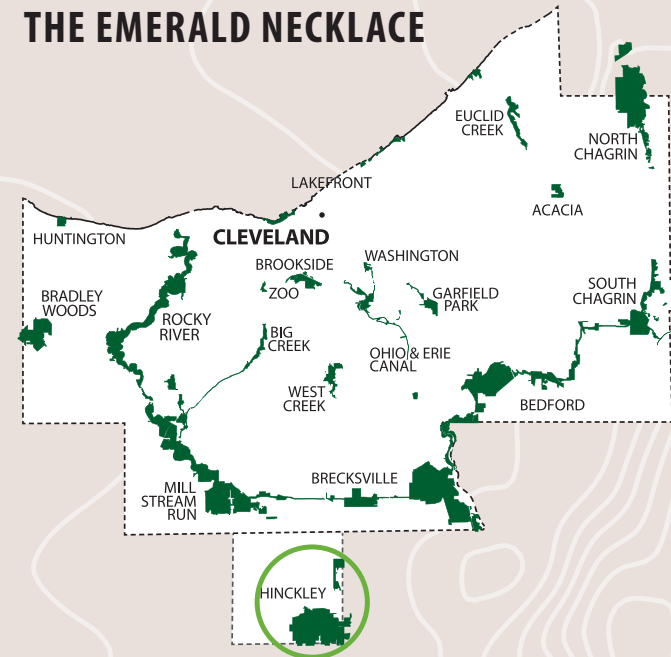
The spillway dam was constructed to hold water from Rocky River. Today it's enjoyed by visitors as a sandy swimming area.

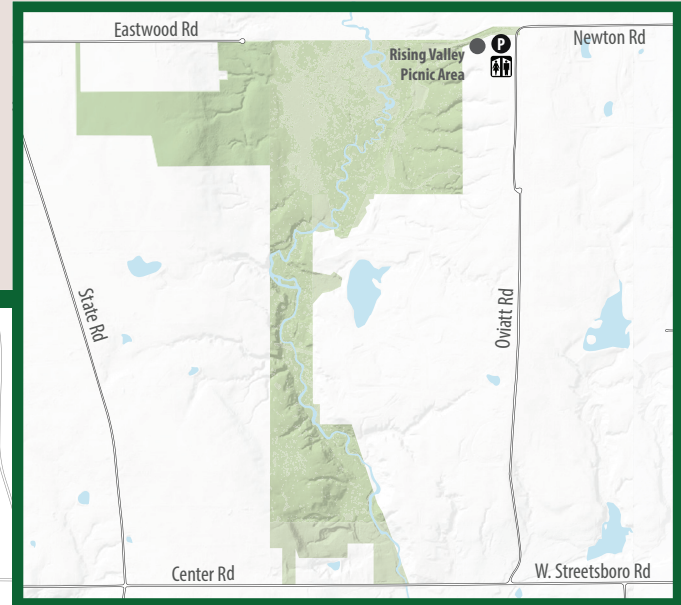
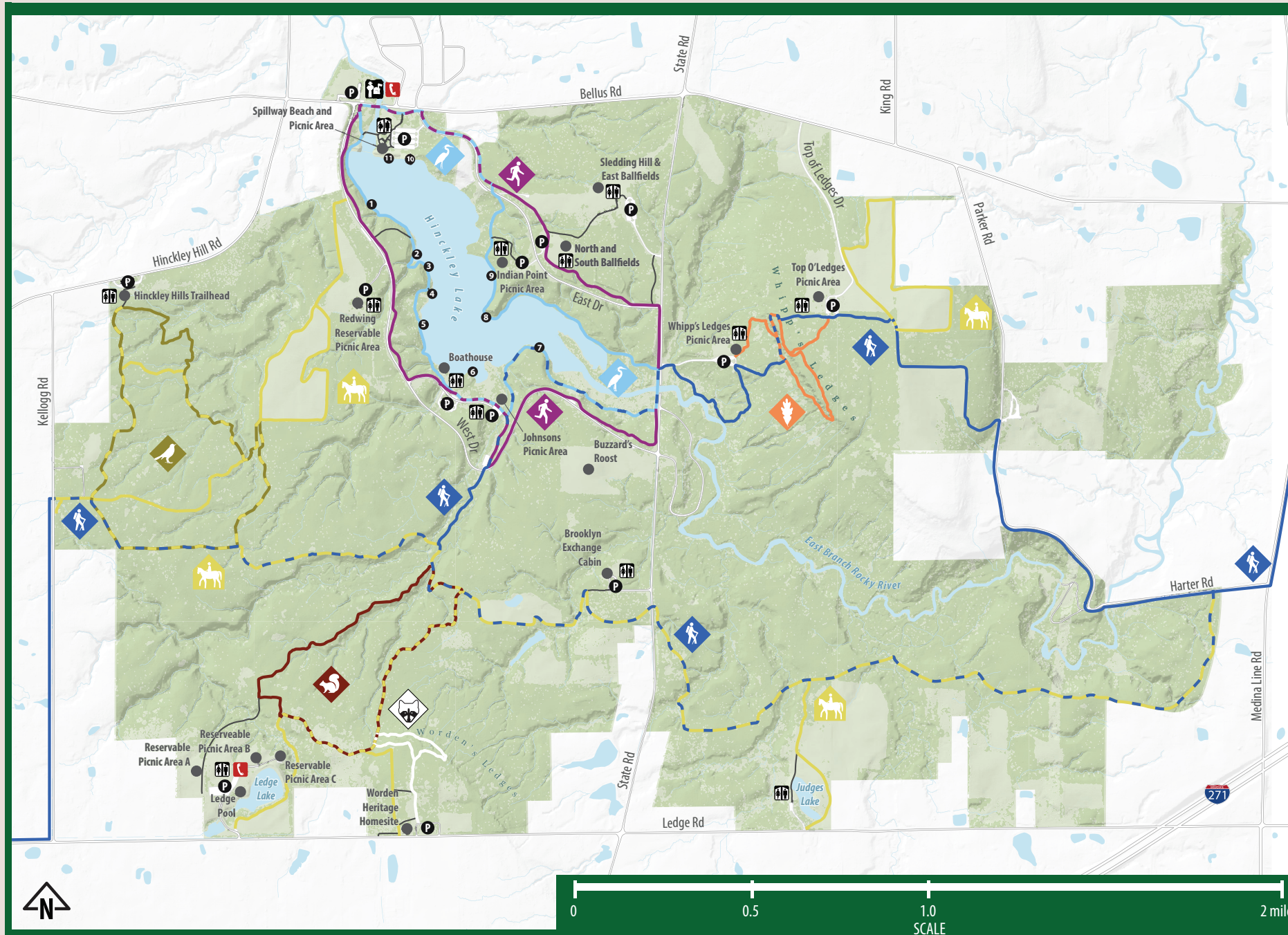
Hinckley Reservation Trails Guide

Cleveland Metroparks® Hinckley Reservation



-  **Hinckley Hills Loop Trail:** 2.5 miles. This rugged trail crosses ravines and streams and follows sections of the Buckeye and bridle trails.
 -  **Hinckley Lake Loop Trail:** 3.4 miles. This trail provides many opportunities for viewing wading birds and waterfowl as it winds around Hinckley Lake.
 -  **Ledge Lake Loop Trail:** 2.5 miles. Starting from Ledge Lake or Worden's Homestead, this dirt trail meanders along creeks and out into open fields.
 -  **Whipp's Ledges Loop Trail:** 1.25 miles. Connecting Whipp's Ledges and Top O' Ledges picnic areas, this hilly trail loops through the spectacular 350 ft. Sharon Conglomerate Ledges.
 -  **Worden's Ledges Loop Trail:** 1 mile. This wooded trail winds through moss and fern covered ledges to reveal carvings made by Noble Stuart in the 1940s.
 -  **Buckeye Trail:** 6 miles. A hilly and rugged portion of the 1,444-mile Buckeye Trail travels through Hinckley Reservation. The trail continues in a large loop around the state.
 -  **All Purpose Trail:** 3.3 miles of paved trail for activities like cycling, walking and inline skating. Motorized vehicles are prohibited.
 -  **Bridle Trail :** 10 miles. These markers denote the bridle trail. Bicycles and motorized vehicles are prohibited.
